

MRAC COVID-19 Guidelines for Staff

General Staff Requirements

- All staff are required to have their temperature checked prior to the start of each shift. If a temperature reads 100.4 or higher, the staff member will be sent home.
- Staff members should not come to the pool if they are exhibiting any COVID symptoms. Please alert a member of the management team if you are unable to attend your scheduled shift for this or any reason.
- All staff members will be required to wear a mask during their shift. This is especially crucial indoors and when in close proximity with patrons. Masks will be provided for staff members. (See lifeguard section for exceptions to this requirement).
- Familiarize yourself with all COVID-19 patron health and safety guidelines to best assist with enforcement of health and safety protocols.

Lifeguards

- Lifeguards will not be required to wear a mask while on the stand. However, lifeguards should keep their mask in the hip pack provided in the event that close interaction with a patron becomes necessary, and to aid with transitioning through the facility.
- Lifeguards will wash their hands regularly. Hand sanitizing stations are available throughout the MRAC facility.
- Lifeguards will be provided with a one-way protective breathing valve in the event that CPR is performed.
- Remind patrons to keep distance from lifeguard stands for their protection as well as that of the lifeguard.
- Help maintain proper social distancing guidelines by reminding patrons of MRAC policy as needed. Please inform a member of the management team if attention is needed in this regard.

Front Desk Staff

- Remind patrons to utilize hand sanitizer station upon entry.
- Sanitize hands after handling of cash, credit card, or user pass card.
- Provide thermometers for staff members upon their arrival, and store temperature log in a secure location.
- Ensure that proper social distancing is maintained as patrons wait in line to enter the facility.
- Provide patrons with information regarding the facility's COVID-19 policies and requirements.

Janitorial Staff

- Wear disposable gloves to clean and disinfect.
- Clean surfaces using soap and water, then use disinfectant. Locker rooms should be cleaned using a fogger to ensure sterilization of the areas.
- Practice routine cleaning of frequently touched surfaces.

Frequently-touched surfaces include:

- Tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, sinks, etc.

Utah's Low Risk (yellow) Phase Pool guidelines

- Open plunge operates at a reduced capacity that enables appropriate physical distancing to be maintained between household groups on the pool deck.
- Face coverings are worn by individuals on the pool deck when physical distancing is not feasible.
- Lap swimming resumes to normal capacity.
- Swim team and swim lessons are allowed as long as physical distancing is followed on the pool deck.
- Lifeguard training is allowable; safeguards encouraged as much as possible during training including symptom checking of trainees (checklist or verbal), including temperature checks when feasible.

- Maintain signage that encourages physical distancing guidelines to be met at all times.
